LIGHTING THE SECOND ADVENT CANDLE

The Advent wreath is a circle with no beginning and no end. It is a symbol of God's unending love and faithfulness.

Its light reminds us of Jesus, the light of the world. In him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. (John 1:4-5)

Today we relight the first candle of the Advent wreath, the candle of HOPE.

Now we light the candle for the second Sunday in Advent. This is the candle of PEACE.

As we prepare for the coming of Jesus we remember that Jesus is our hope, and he is our peace.

The prophet Isaiah says:

"For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."

--Isaiah 9:6-7

From the Gospel of John:

"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." --John 14:27 Let us pray:

Gracious God, grant that we may find peace as we prepare for our Lord's coming. May our personal divisions be peacefully resolved. May there be peace in our cities and in the countries of our world. Jesus, you are the Prince of Peace; help us to see the paths of peace in our lives, and then give us courage to follow them. Amen.
