Note: this familiar Christmas carol by Isaac Watts was not written specifically for Christmas but as a paraphrase of Psalm 98:4-9, which we just prayed together. Watts did intend it to reflect the notion of the coming King, which applies both to Christmas and to the final triumphant return of Christ. The tune we are singing this morning is not the usual one we know, but a tune that will help us reflect on the words in a new way.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION AND REFLECTION

Merciful God, you plant each of us like seeds in the field of your world, and like plants we grow and are nourished by your sun and rain. We thank you for how graciously and tenderly you care for us and help us to grow and bear fruit.
